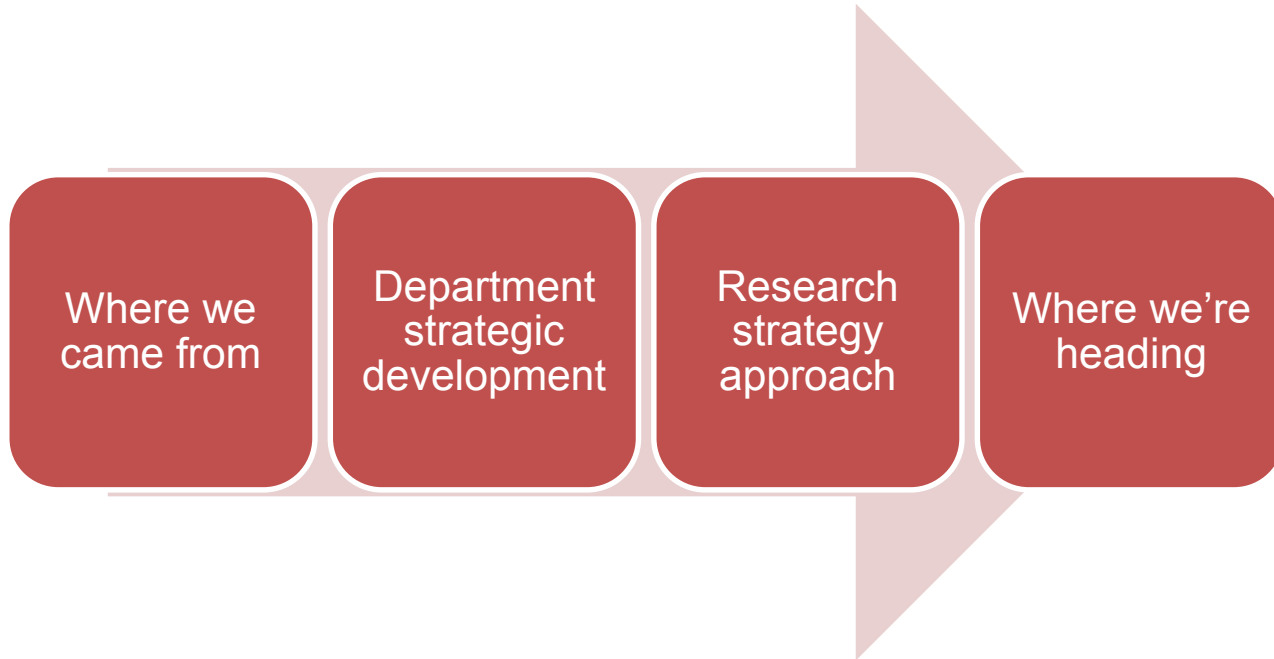

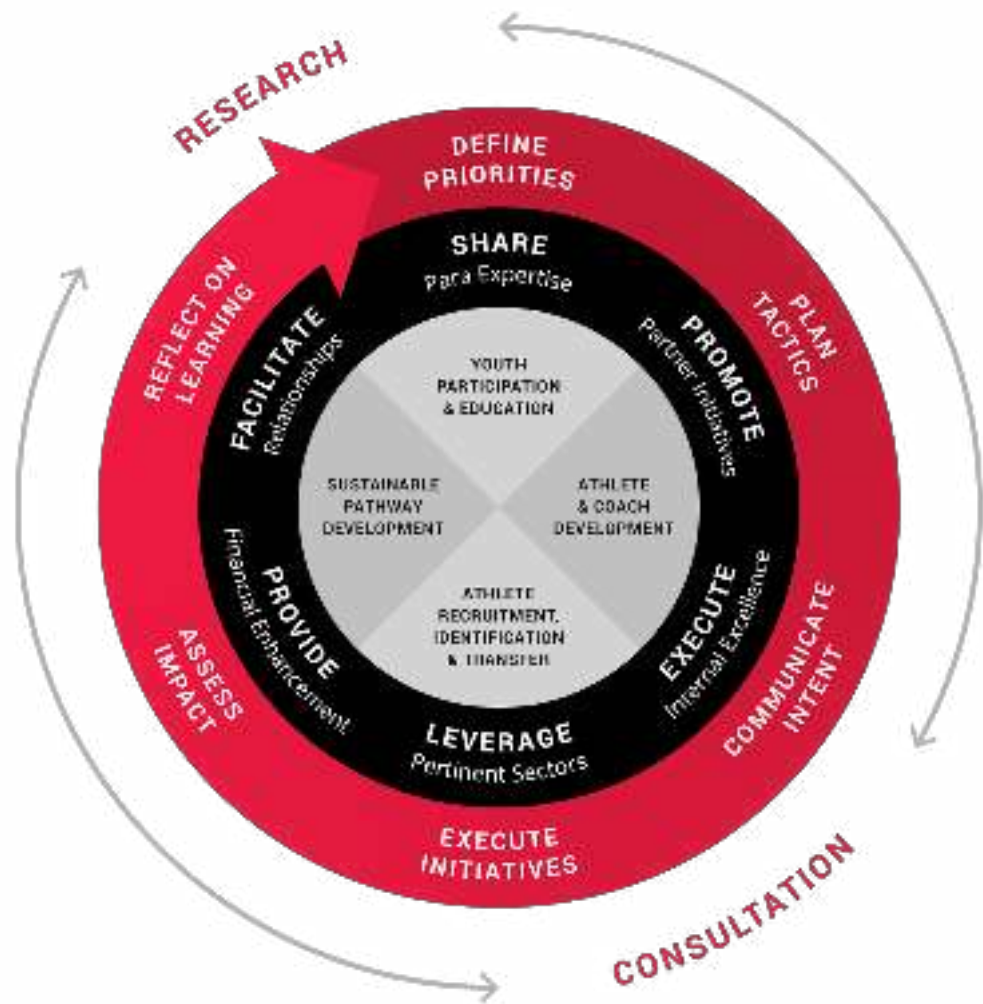

OUR GOAL

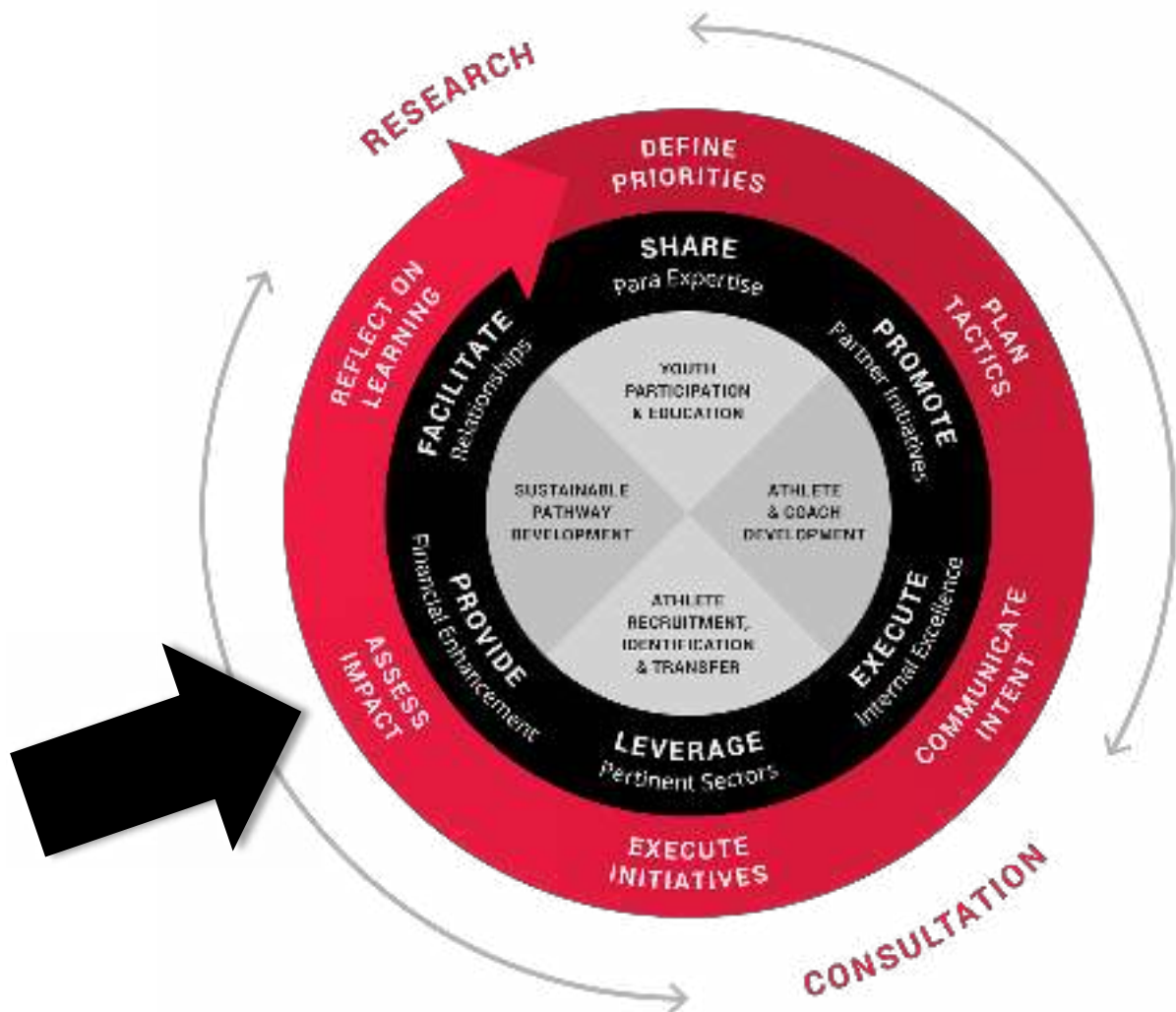
Work with partners to support positive early sport experiences, appropriate skill training, access to qualified coaches, and suitable classification and competition so our athletes and coaches can thrive.

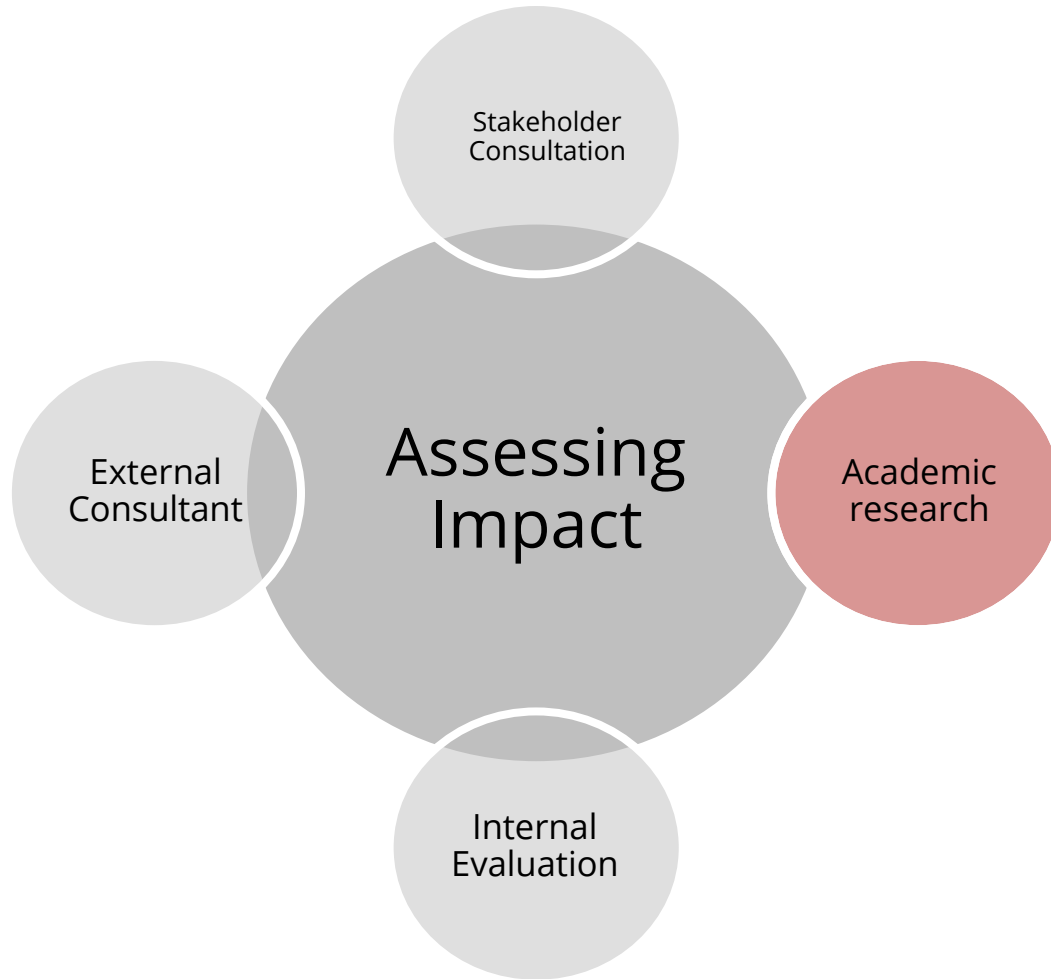


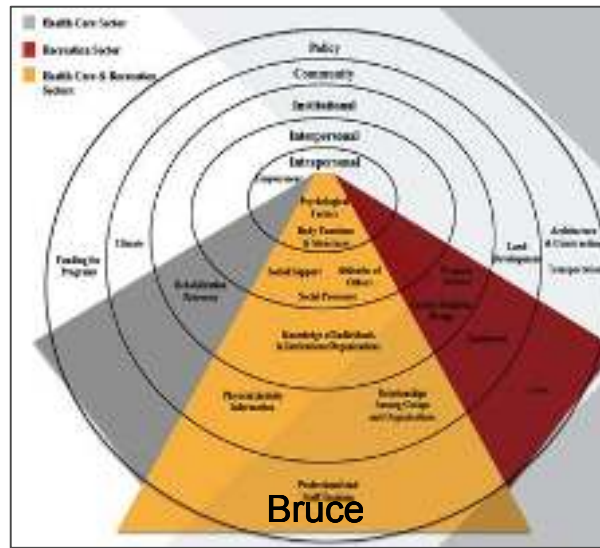

In 2015, struggle to use all available funding due to low # of asks

\$148,000 ask

\$48,000 distributed

Significant knowledge of barriers & facilitators (rooted in research)

Used to inform and adapt criteria to be more appropriate to need of para programming

2017 able to better tailor grant criteria based on evidence

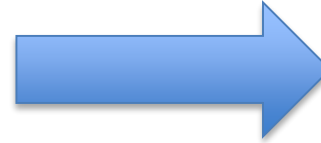
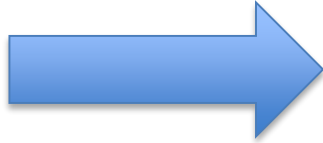
