The Winnipeg Community Sport Policy has re-defined the role of the City of Winnipeg in the delivery of sport along with each partner organization. The new Policy references the **Canadian Sport for Life Model** and identifies each Winnipeg Sport partner's role in the delivery of sport in life long physical activity. Using a community development approach and a Collective Impact framework, the Policy partners continue to work together to increase and complement the health and wellness of Winnipeg citizens.

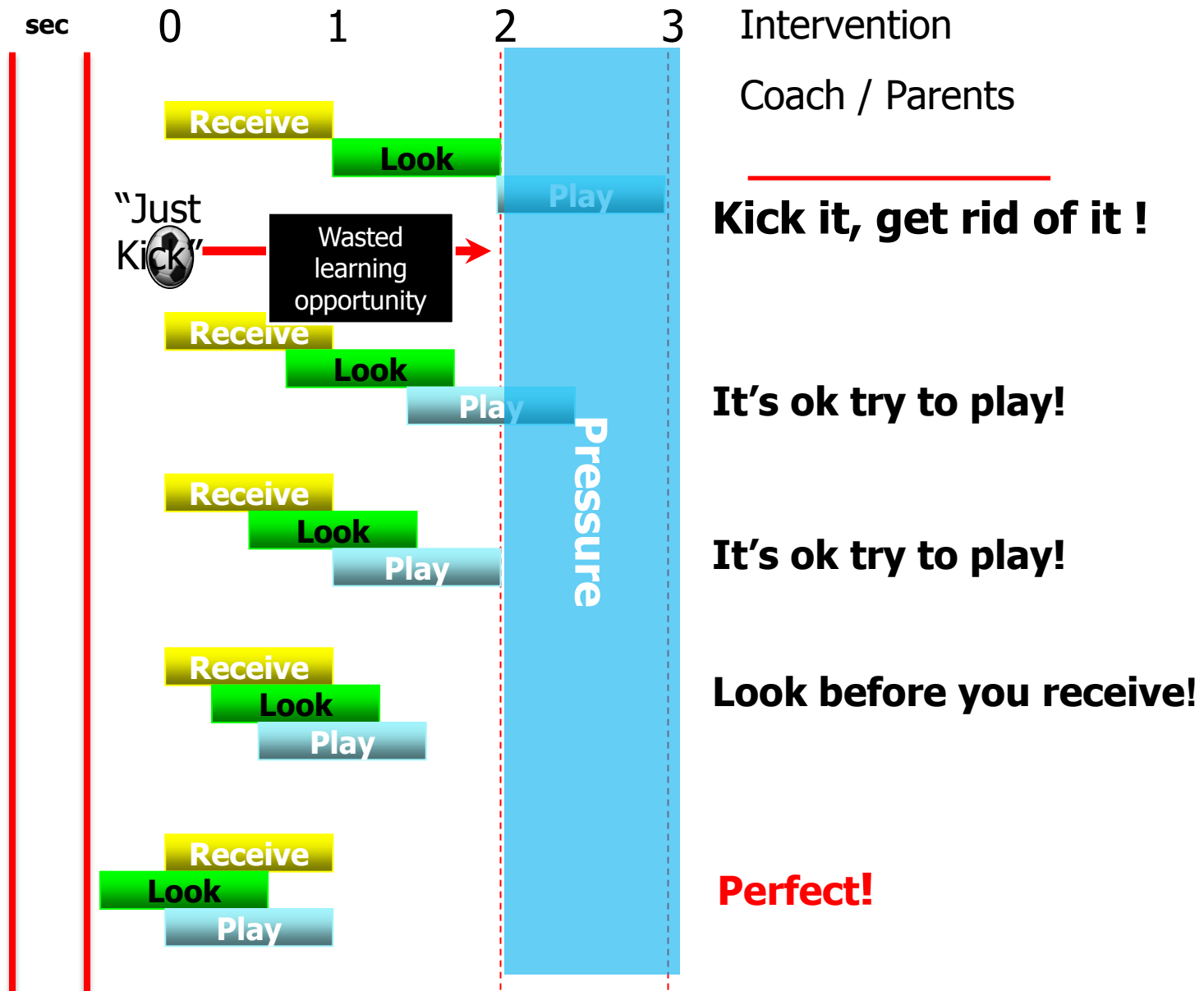

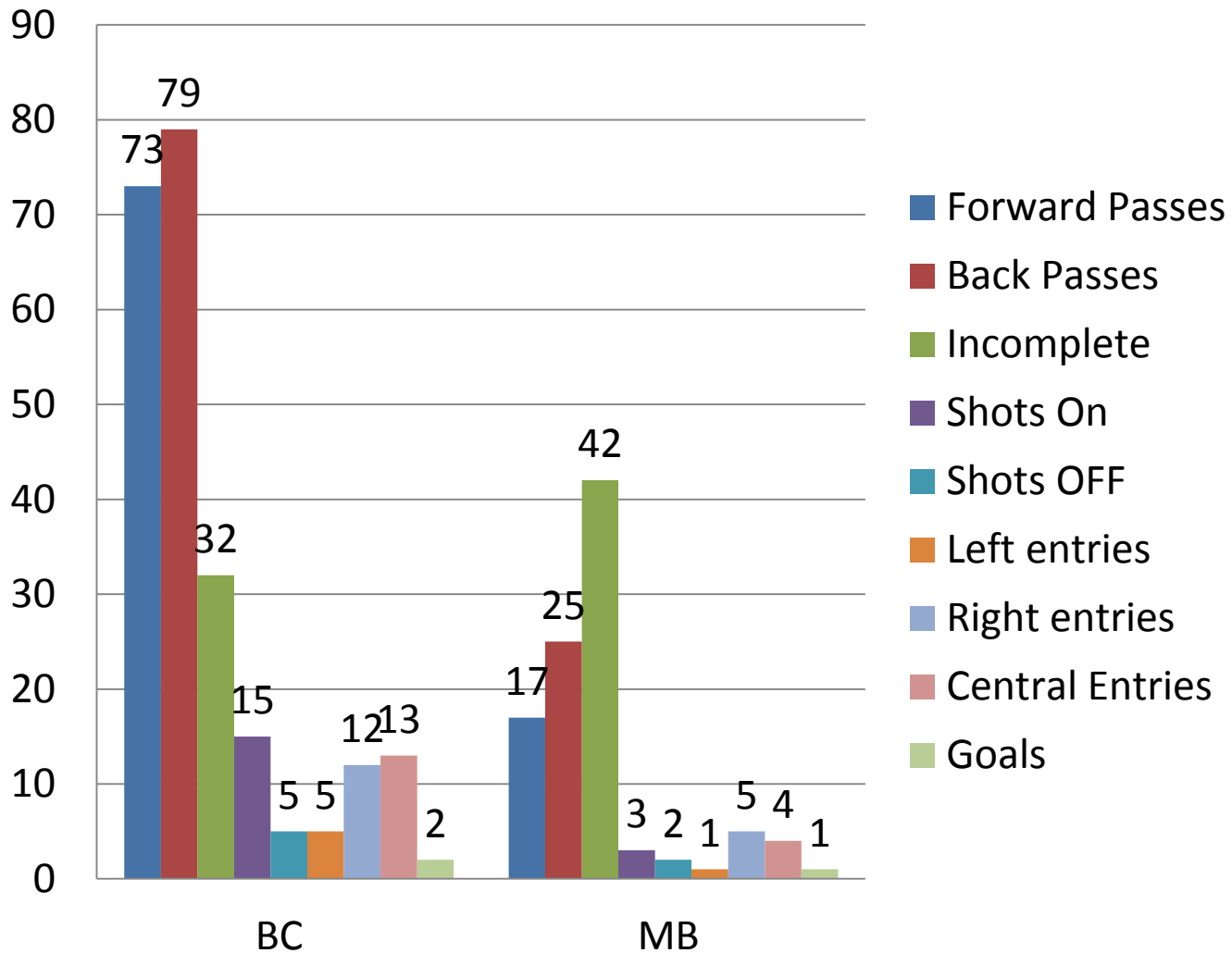

Parents and coaching education: encourage kids to learn to play and take risks





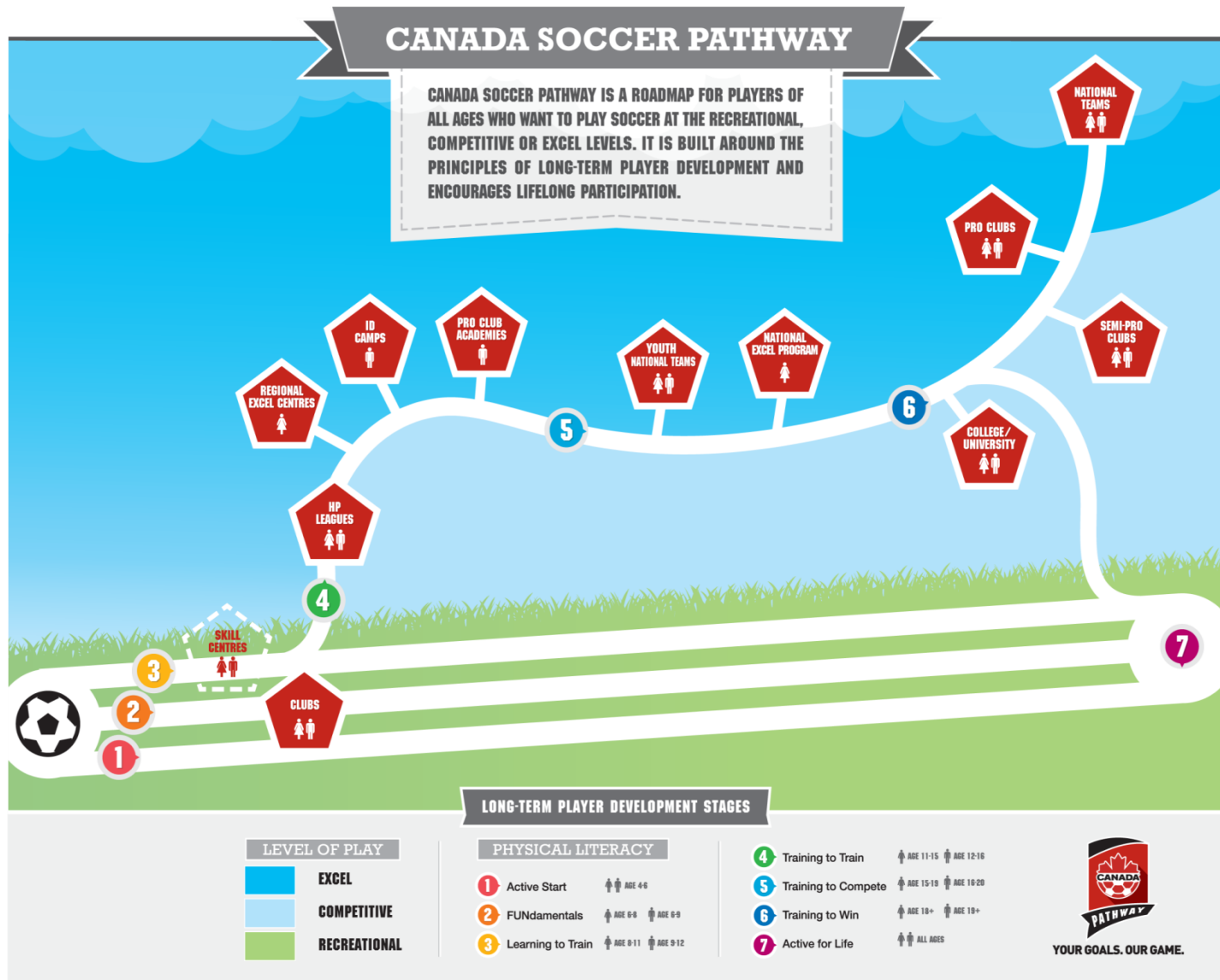
U13B - MB vs BC Technical Analysis

- Develop program standards and evaluation methods



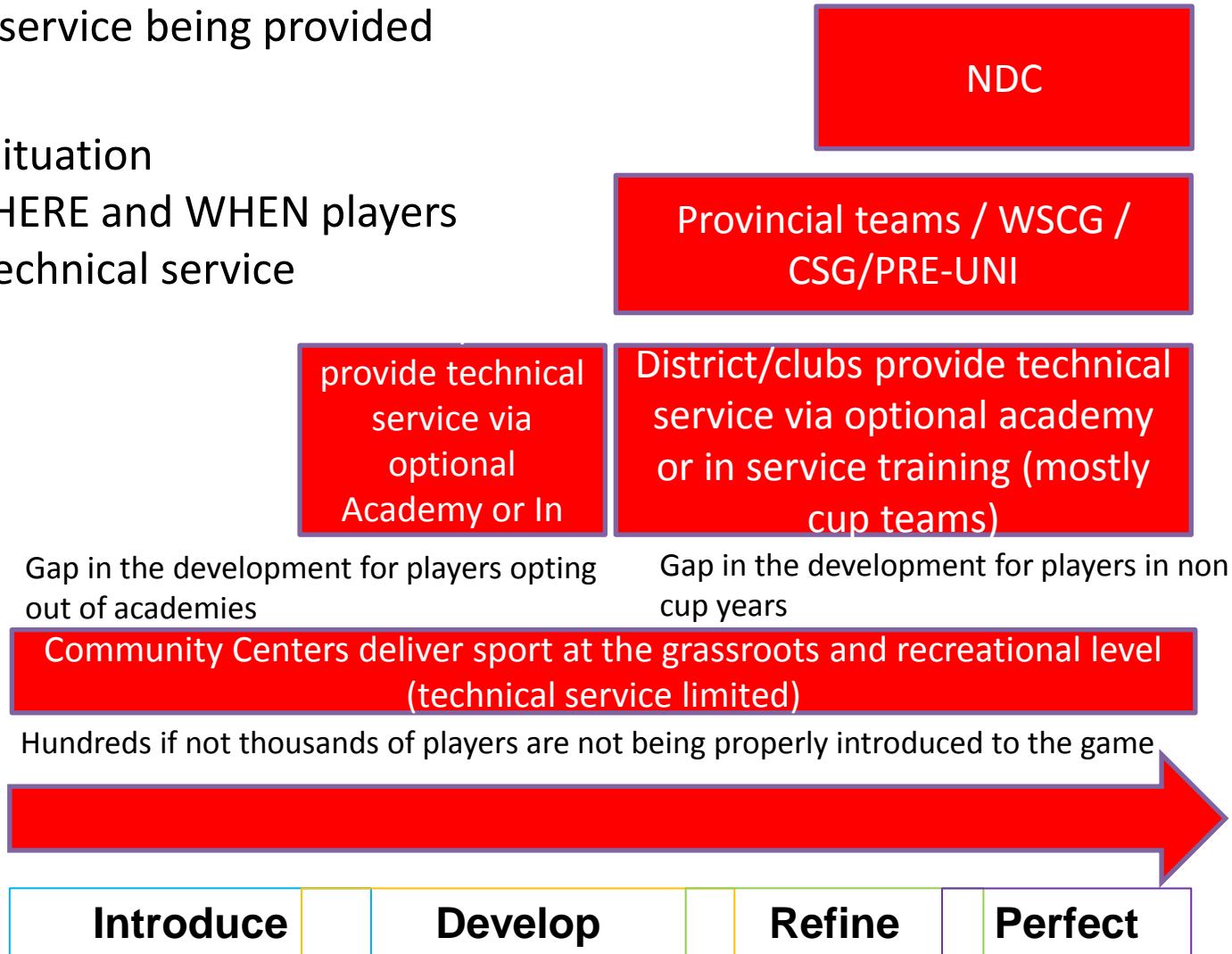
District-Club Technical Structure

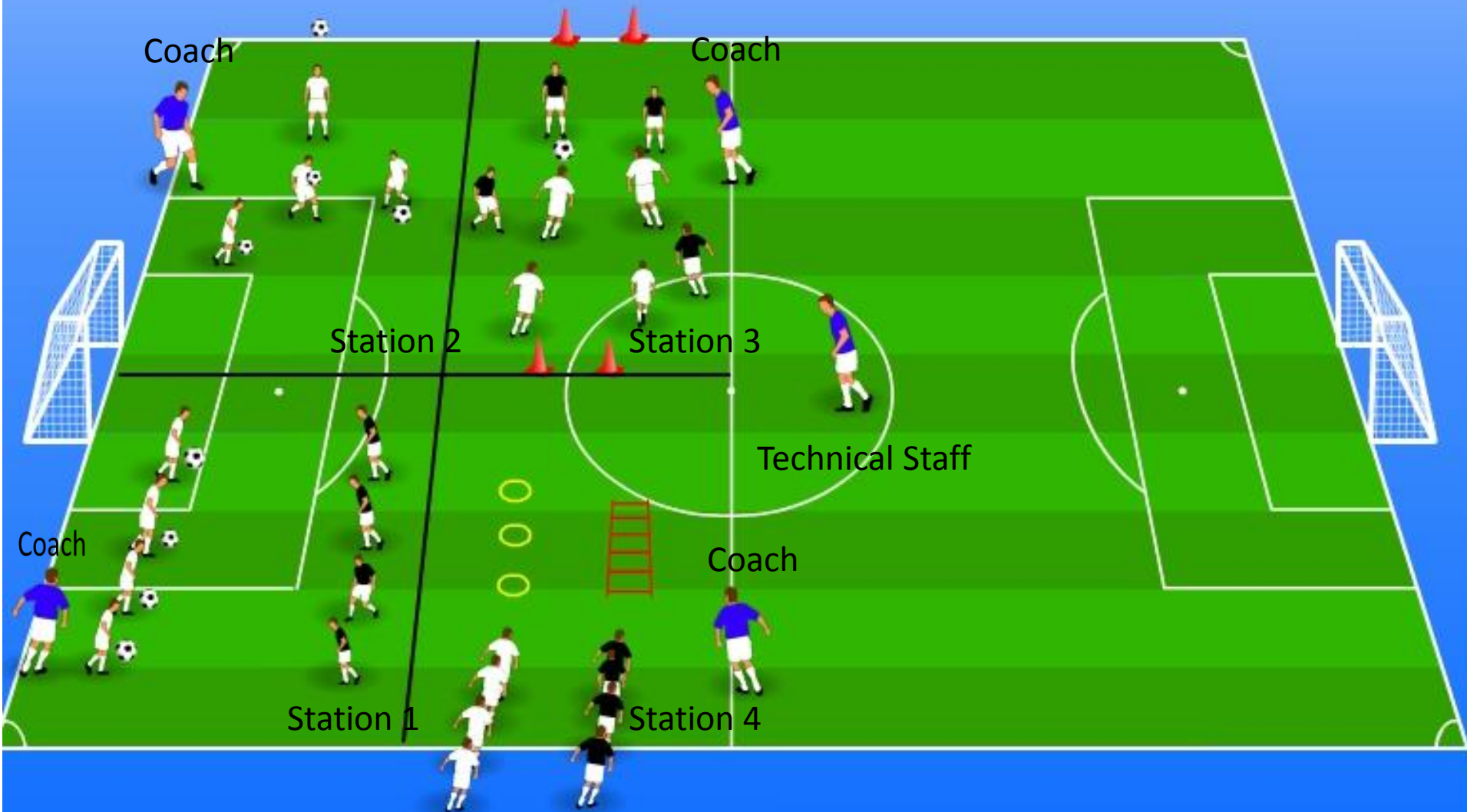

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Actions:

4.3.1

Create a process to ensure programs developed by the partners will reflect CS4L's 7 stages and the soccer LTPD model:

- Provide opportunities to educate the facility owners and local sport agencies about the CS4L
- Encourage that program funding be consistent with CS4L model
- Future sport programming inventories will be evaluated based on the CS4L model



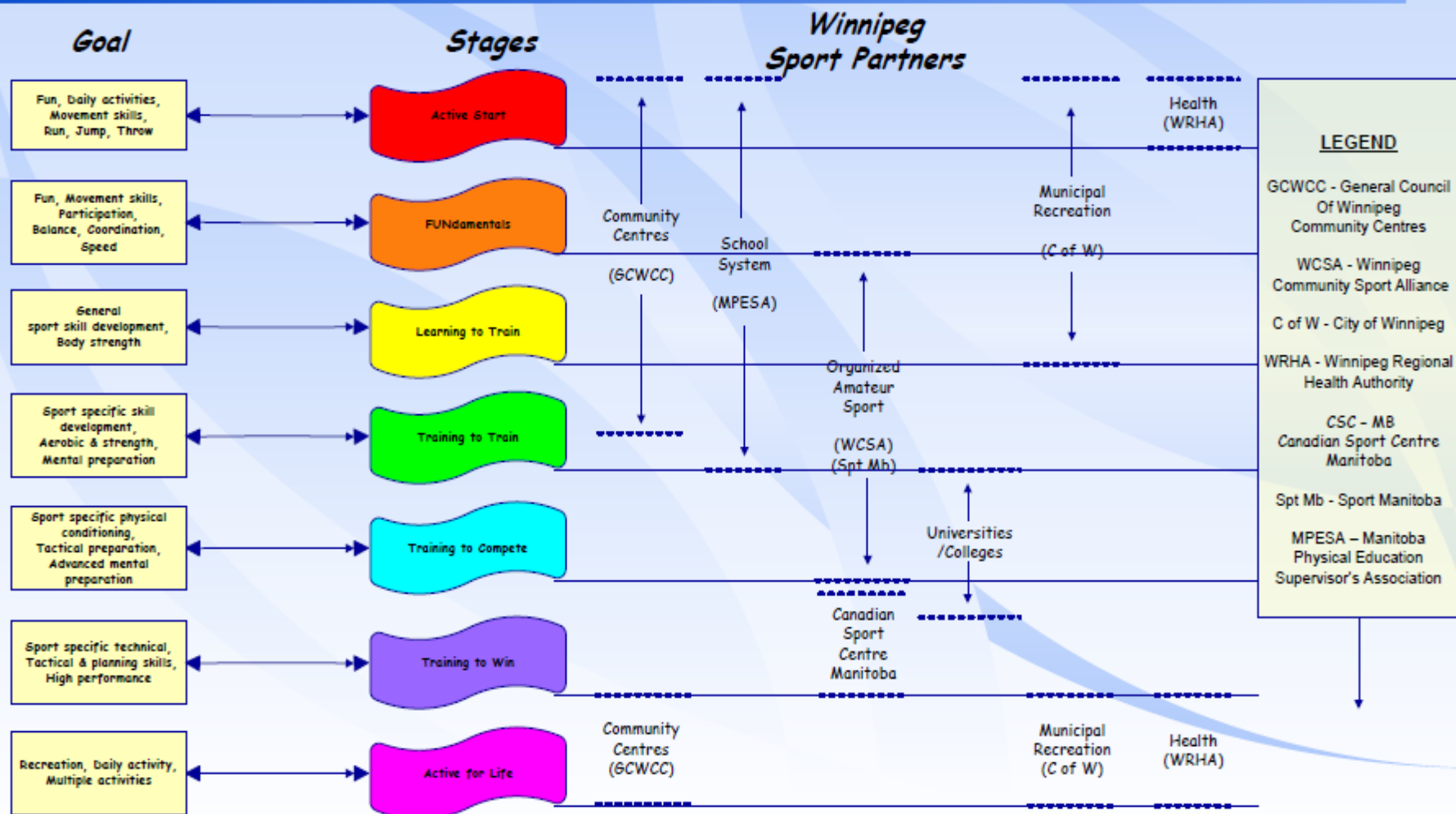
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WCSP Partnerships

Partnerships will be encouraged to maximize program opportunities, share capital and operating costs, and provide a diversity of sustainable sport and recreation options.

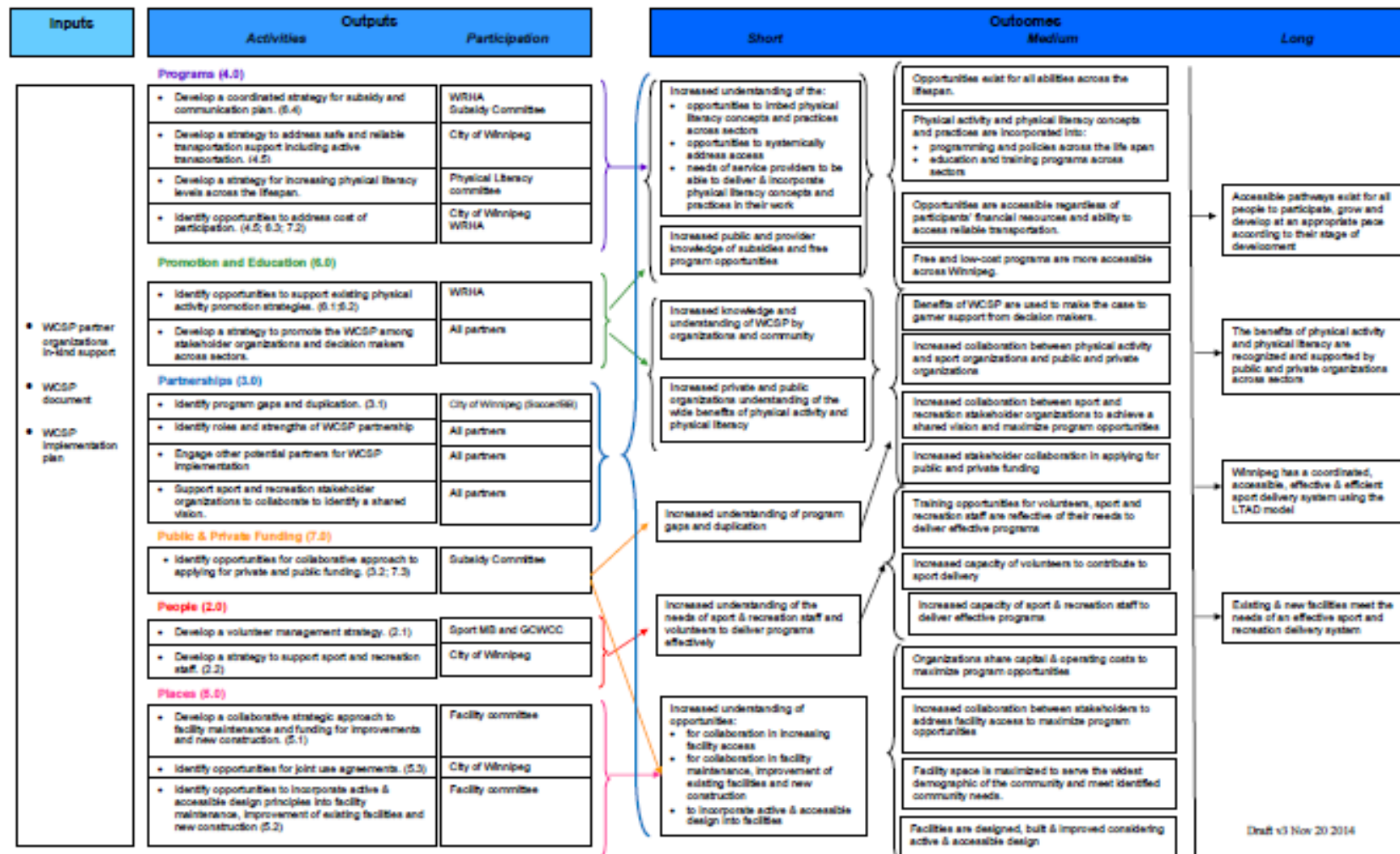
