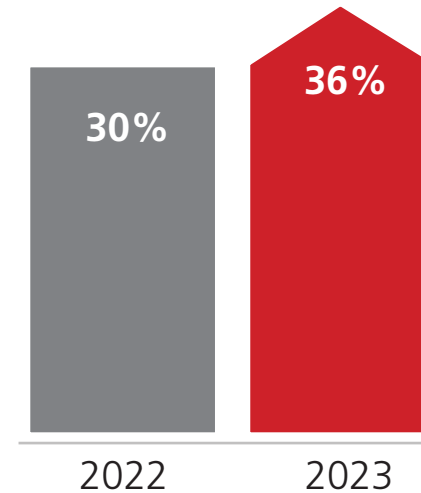


Sport for Life

9% Board/Committee Members

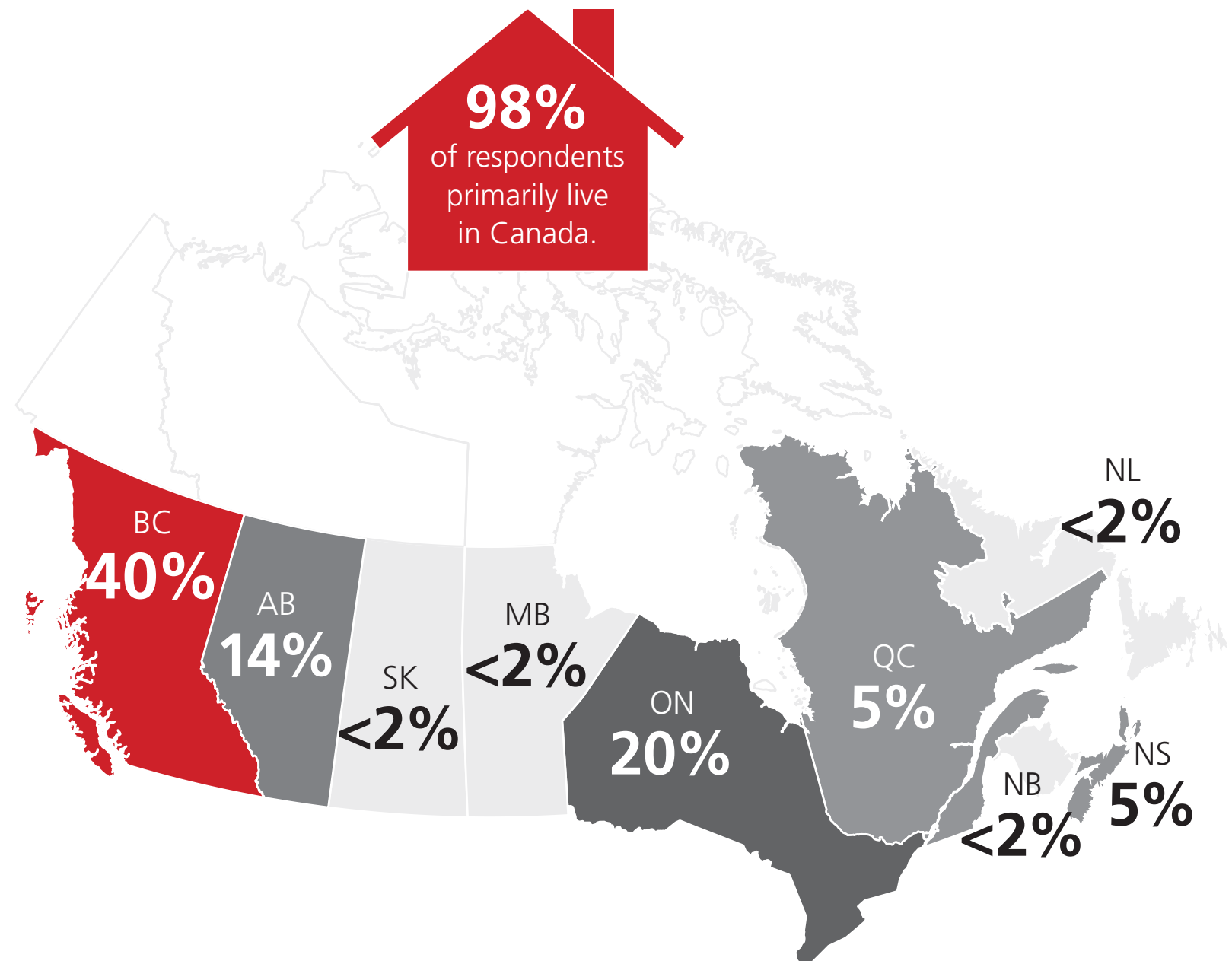

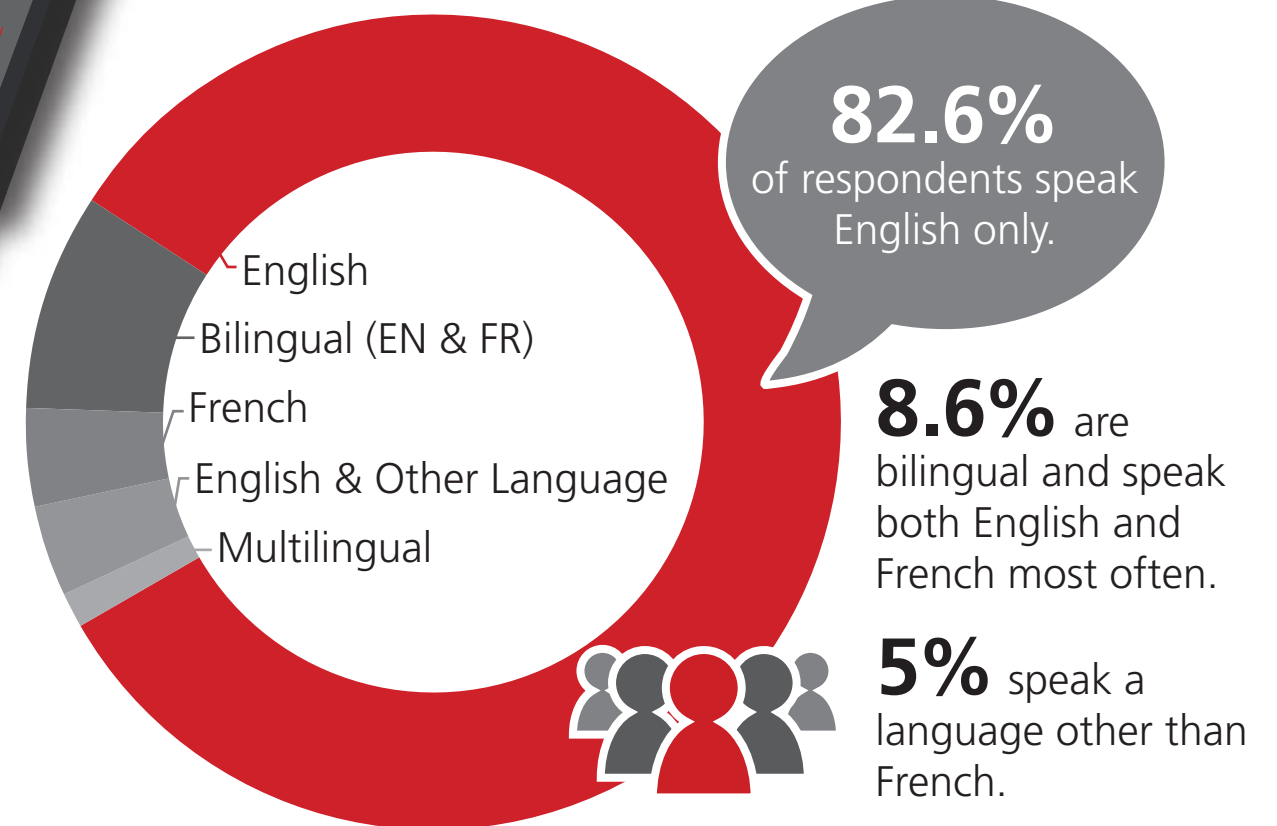

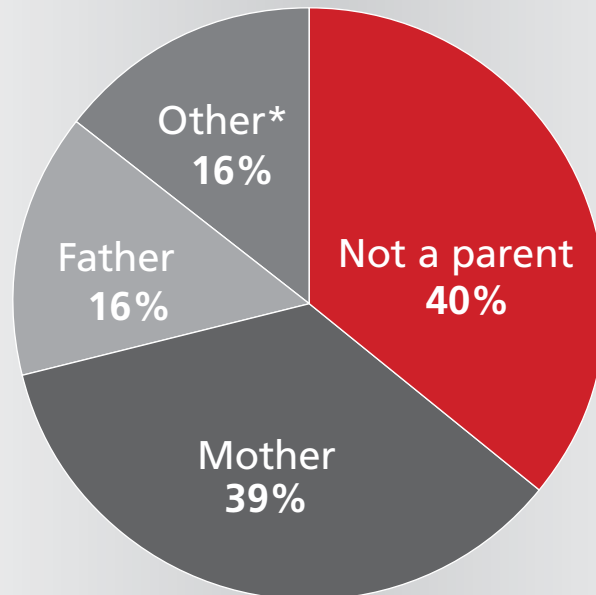

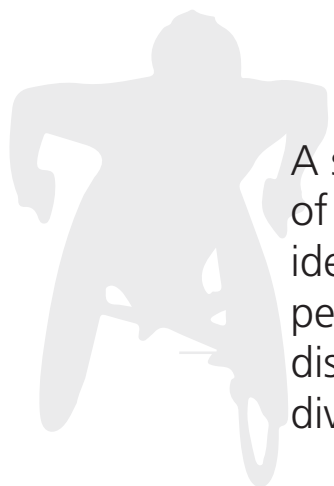
