

## SPORT FOR LIFE SOCIETY GUIDELINE

### Definitions

1. These terms will have the following meanings in these Guidelines:
  - a) **Sport for Life Society** (the “Society”)
  - b) **Sport Integrity Canada** is an independent, national, not-for-profit organization that works to protect and promote the integrity of sport in Canada. Through the administration of its programs, including the Canadian Anti-Doping Program and the Canadian Safe Sport Program, we strive to ensure sport is safe, inclusive, fair, clean, and accessible for all Canadians.
  - c) **Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP)** Sport Integrity Canada implements and administers the CADP on behalf of the Canadian sport community. It's designed to prevent, deter and detect doping and serves to protect the integrity of sport and the rights of clean athletes.
    - i. The CADP is compliant with the [World Anti-Doping Code](#) (Code) and all [International Standards](#) that address technical areas, as well as the associated Technical Documents.
  - d) **Representative(s)** - Any individual elected, acclaimed, or appointed by the Society (the “Society”), or engaged under an executed written agreement with the Society as an employee, volunteer, or independent contractor to provide services on behalf of Sport for Life.

### Purpose

2. The Society is committed to clean sport in Canada and endorses the Canadian Anti-Doping Program and the World Anti-Doping Code. These guidelines confirm that the Society adopts the CADP and, in principle, commits to eliminating doping in sport.
3. The Society has adopted and agrees to abide by the Canadian Anti-Doping Program, as administered and amended from time to time.

### Scope and Authority

4. These Guidelines apply to all Representatives.
5. Organizations, athletes, athlete support personnel, and other persons belonging to sport organizations that have adopted the CADP accept the rules as a condition of participation in sport and agree to be bound by these rules.
6. The Society will respect any penalty imposed for a breach of the Canadian Anti-Doping Program, whether by WADA or Sport Integrity Canada.

7. The Society will respect the sanctions applicable due to an anti-doping rule violation, whether imposed by WADA, Sport Integrity Canada, or any national or provincial sport organization.
8. All Representatives and persons sanctioned by virtue of the CADP will be ineligible to participate in any role and in any competition or activity organized, convened, held, or sanctioned by the Society as per the penalties imposed.

**Provisions**

9. The Society is unequivocally opposed to the practice of doping in sport on ethical, medical, and legal grounds.
10. In the event of a conflict between other anti-doping policies established by the Society and the CADP, the CADP shall prevail.
11. The Society will provide updates on the anti-doping program, both domestically and internationally, as applicable.
12. The Society will comply with the CADP regarding public announcements of positive test results.
